In literature and writing, a figure of speech (also called stylistic device or rhetorical device) is the use of any of a variety of techniques to give an auxiliary meaning, idea, or feeling. Sometimes a word diverges from its normal meaning, or a phrase has a specialized meaning not based on the literal meaning of the words in it.

Rhetorical and Stylistic Devices Alliteration The repetition in successive words of the same initial consonant sound or of any vowel sound -creates a strong, emotional response ... -Disguises truth, often used by politicians and in censorship endeavours -Used to downplay a potentially bleak situation Example: Kick the bucket.
